


## Digitalisation

Small scale fisheries	<ul> <li>After 2 years: geolocalisation + electronic catch reporting (vessels 12-15m)</li> <li>After 4 years: same provisions for all vessels &lt; 12m</li> </ul>	Derogations	ernal flee
Recreational fisheries	<ul> <li>Electronic catch recording (after 2Y for quotas species, other species depending on scientific advice from 2030). Data collection for all other species (2Y).</li> </ul>		
No more paper	<ul> <li>All catch registration documents become electronic (2 to 4 Y)</li> <li>Electronic transport documents and inspection reports (2Y)</li> </ul>		
Traceability	<ul> <li>More information required and responsibility of operators to make it available</li> <li>Information made available in a digital way</li> <li>Fresh and frozen products: (2Y)</li> <li>Prepared and preserved + Algae (5Y), after secondary legislation adopted</li> <li>EU and imported products: same provisions</li> </ul>		



### **New control tools/data**





#### • Catching vessels > 18 m at high/very high risk of illegal discards

- 4 years after entry into force (2028)
- Secondary legislation needed on fleet segments, technical specifications, storage, exchange of and access to the data.

Engine power

- **Continuous monitoring** for certain categories of vessels (ex: engine above 221 KW + towed gears + risk assessment)
- 4 years after entry into force (2028)

### Logbook

- Unique fishing identification number
- Reporting of **sensitive species** and lost gears
- For vessels > 12m reporting haul by haul

### **Control of the EU external fleet**

### Prior notification EU vessels landing in non-EU Countries

48h prior to landing: notification to the flag Member State.



If switched off for exceptional circumstances: report the action and reason to the flag Member State and, if relevant, to the coastal State.

<u>Authorisation</u> for transhipments outside EU waters and in non-EU ports

Request to the flag Member State: 48h in advance.

Authorisation is necessary before transhipment.

(NB: transhipment outside ports in EU waters remains banned)



## Sanctions/enforcement further harmonization

 Infringements
 2 Categories of serious infringements:

 Serious infringement per se (objectively pre-identified as serious);
 Qualification of seriousness based on harmonised criteria

 New infringements – e.g.

 Conducting fishing activities with the use of forced labour
 Illegally disposing of a fishing gear at sea

Minimum sanctions

Minimum levels of minimum sanctions or standard rates for serious infringements

#### Point system

**Harmonised points** for serious infringements for the holder of fishing licence and for the master – secondary legislation to follow on registration of masters and on the recording of points assigned to them.

## **Derogations to 10% margin of tolerance (MOT)**



Margin of Tolerance (MOT) for quantities retained on board maintained at 10% per each species.

*	Species <	100 Kg	- MOT is 20%	% per each species
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**Derogations** 

- Unsorted small pelagic, industrial and tropical purse seiner fisheries

   specific rules under fulfilment of certain conditions
- Baltic multi-annual plan species:
  - Revocation of the current MOT 10% per total Catch
  - MOT 20% per each species, during only 4 years (until end 2028)



## **Tropical purse seiner fisheries**

If landed in listed ports ensuring adequate control and accuracy on weighing and catch registration

In case of <u>species representing</u>:

- ♦  $\geq$  2% in weight of all species MOT 10% of TOTAL of all species, applied per <u>each</u> species
- <2% in weight of all species MOT 200Kg or 0.5% of TOTAL of all species per <u>each</u> species

✤ For the total quantity of species → MOT 10% of the total quantity of all species



→ Secondary legislation (6 months after entry into force)



### **Tropical purse seiner fisheries**



Alternatively (landings <u>not in listed ports</u>)

In case of species representing:

- ♦  $\geq$  2% in weight of all species  $\square$  MOT 10% per <u>each</u> species
- ♦ <2% in weight of all species → MOT 200Kg or 20% per <u>each</u> species
