# Process of the development of the FAO Guidance (1/2)

- →2021 June/August: FAO informal regional consultations with Members
  - 8 regional consultations worldwide
    - (1) Europe, (2) Central Asia, (3) Africa, (4) Near East and North Africa,
      - (5) South America, (6) Caribbean, Brazil, USA and Canada,
      - (7) Mesoamerica, y (8) Asia/Oceania
  - <u>6 official UN languages</u>, as well as all the documents shared with participants were translated.
  - 66 countries
  - 148 experts and representatives nominated by countries
  - Other UN Agencies: ILO, UNCTAD, IMO




## Things to be taken into consideration when drafting the FAO Guidance:

3 pillars:

Human and labour rights

Decent working conditions

Social protection



should cover the entire value chains

- Take into account national realities and capacities – developing countries, SSF
- Target audience: private sector
- Also, valuable reference instrument: policy makers, RFMOs and civil society

- Voluntary
- Non-binding
- Practical
- Complementary

- Simple language
- Supportive and based on the existing international conventions, agreements and standards
